Satisfy your love of art with a visit to the Art Gallery of Hamilton, which features an exhibition of finalists in the RBC Canadian Painting Competition from October 19 to 30. Adjudicated by the Canadian Art Foundation, this Competition features the best work of emerging artists from across Canada.

Entering its third season, the AGH CIBC Wood Gundy Film Festival (September 23 to October 2) has quickly become an eagerly anticipated fall event. This year's Festival offers award-winning films and documentaries from the Cannes Film Festival, Sundance Film Festival, Tribeca Film Festival and the Toronto International Film Festival, as well as a selection of French films from both France and Quebec.

The AGH fall line-up also features "Connections", a series of five talks focusing on such diverse subjects as French historical painting, costume jewellery, footwear fashion, photography and quilts. Each talk is led by a noted expert or a private collector, connecting each topic with AGH exhibitions currently on view.



A Living History

Hamilton's museums and historical attractions are unique, in that they literally bring history to life. Imagine yourself engaged in a major naval battle, as you stand on the deck of HMCS Haida, a Tribal Class Destroyer used by the Royal Canadian Navy in World War II, the Korean War and the Cold War. Climb into the cockpit of a real jet fighter and test your skills on the interactive combat flight simulators at Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum, where aviation buffs will also marvel at the museum's collection of real flying aircraft from WWII to modern jet fighters.

hands-on exhibits keep kids educated and entertained


Journey further back in-time and immerse yourself in Canada's early history with historical performances offered by tour guides at Dundurn Castle, home to Sir Allan MacNab, one of Canada's first premiers. The adjoining Hamilton Military Museum provides a hands-on guide to Canada's military involvement from the early 1800's to World War I, with special displays highlighting the War of 1812 Bicentennial. Visitors can further explore Hamilton's historical heritage through different eras at Battlefield House, Whitehern Historic House and Garden, Fieldcote Memorial Park & Museum, Griffin House and the Hamilton Museum of Steam & Technology, where one of two 45-foot high, 70-ton steam engines are demonstrated daily. The Hamilton Children's Museum is also a great place for fall, family outings with hands-on exhibits to keep kids educated and entertained on those cooler, blustery fall days.






